

Mobile Food Pantry

MWPC hosts a mobile food pantry for an average of 150 families (reaching over 450 individuals) several times a year in partnership with the Freestore Foodbank. Each family can select up to 50 pounds of food, typically including meat and fresh vegetables, items that aren't usually available at smaller food pantries. This year they encouraged attendees to participate in making soup mixes for SEM pantry as part of our mission to feed the hungry and handed out wooded spoons with MWPC's name to those visiting our booth. The soup mixes and spoons were a great hit!

Welcoming Visitors

Every Sunday after worship the Care Ministry usher greets new visitors with a smile at the "Welcome Center" near the sanctuary, gives them a MWPC water bottle, gets their contact information and helps them find their way around our church and our ministries. In addition, the membership committee will provide an entry point into church activities for repeat visitors or those expressing interest in future membership.

Membership and Attendance Data

The membership committee regularly reviews attendance and membership data to identify trends and take actions to retain current membership rolls. Serve

- Must be gathered under a common interest.

- Has a main contact/leader

Main Contact Responsibilities

- Serves as contact point for Deacons (Small Groups roll up under Deacons when asking for church resources as well as for reporting on number of members)
- Maintains group email account (to communicate with Deacons and to receive inquiries from potential new members)
- Creating a brief annual report
- Informs Associate Pastor of major member concerns (ie hospitalization, familial deaths, etc)
